

HGSA Away Days



HULL FC (74 miles)

MKM Stadium - capacity (25,586)
Walton St, Hull, HU3 6HU.

DIRECTIONS

Approach Hull from the M62 leading on to the A63. Follow the dual carriageway under the Humber Bridge onto the A63 'Clive Sullivan Way'.

You will approach a fly-over, directly before this, stay left onto the slip road sign posted 'Infirmery' and 'MKM Stadium' At the roundabout, take the second exit 'Rawling Way'.

At the next main set of lights (with the hospital in front of you) take a left turn on to A1105 Anlaby Road towards the stadium visible directly to your right.

Continue over the fly-over and down to the next set of lights.

For supporter match day parking turn right. For people using a sat-nav, the post code is HU3 6HU.

PARKING

There is on site parking at the stadium, charge of £5 to park on the Walton Street car Park. Gates open three hours before kick-off and close three hours after the final hooter. Please note any vehicles left after this time will be charged with a £75 penalty.

Park & Ride at Priory Park is clearly signposted on the A63 when entering from the west of the city. With up to 650 parking spaces, regular buses travel straight down Anlaby Road, stopping at the Stadium and continuing into Hull City Centre.

There is also parking in the city centre and some street parking (check for restrictions)

TRAIN

Direct services from Huddersfield/Leeds to Hull Paragon Interchange.

Stadium is a 20-30 minute walk from the station depending on route,

Route 1 - Through station/St Stephens centre across Park St and onto Londesborough St, follow to end and onto the bridge, cross the railway to the stadium.

Route 2 - Exit station onto Ferensway, turn right, right again into Anlaby Rd, past hospital and over flyover, stadium on the right through the park.

PRE/POST MATCH

Hull city centre, especially around the old town has some great pubs, there's also 2 Wetherspoons too, the nearest is Admiral of the Humber, across the road from Paragon station, Three John Scott's is further on near the old town and there's a head of steam on King St near the minster.

There are lots of places to eat and drink around Princes Quay and around Humber St at the marina and a bit further away from the stadium on Princes Avenue.

Around the ground, there are a few pubs, eateries, chippy's etc along Anlaby Rd going away from the ground, most of them are home pubs but Giants fans are more than welcome in them too.

The once popular Brickmakers arms on Walton St is now a restaurant.

MATCHDAY

Away fans are usually situated in the North Stand behind the goals or in the NE corner, although there is no strict segregation.

Ticket prices are usually between £28 - £31 for visiting fans.
