

HGSA Away Days



ST HELENS (46 miles)

Totally Wicked stadium - capacity (18,000)

McManus Drive, Peasley Cross Lane, Saint Helens, WA9 3AL

DIRECTIONS

M62/M60/M62 towards Liverpool, exit M62 at J7 Rainhill Stoops, go round the roundabout, take the 4th exit s/p St Helens A570 and head down dual carriageway, at the 2nd roundabout, with McDonalds/Petrol station, go straight across into Sherdley Rd, then left into Peasley Cross Rd, the ground is down here on the left.

PARKING

DON'T PARK AT Tesco next to the ground!

There are car parks in the Town centre, which is a 10 minute walk from the ground.

CHALON WAY - At the roundabout with McDonalds, take a left, go across 2 more roundabouts then right at the 3rd roundabout, the car park is on the right. For the ground, exit the car park and head right, past the glass museum, under the railway bridge, over the canal and straight on over the Steve Prescott Bridge and around the side of Tesco- follow the crowds!

PARR STREET/CENTRAL STATION - Either follow the above route to the ground, past the ground and retail park, 2nd exit off the roundabout, Parr St is on the right, continue on a bit further, turn right into Shaw St for central station parking. For the ground, walk back along Parr St, back across the roundabout and head straight down, immediately after the railway bridge are the steps to the ground.

There is some street parking around Peasley Cross Rd and Sherdley Rd but be aware of local residents schemes and restrictions.

TRAIN

Huddersfield to St Helens central would generally involve a couple of changes, but the best option we've found is Huddersfield-Lea Green, it's a direct service on the Trans Pennine to Liverpool service and takes around 1hr, Lea Green is then a 10 minute bus ride to the ground or a 30-35 minute walk, the buses also head into town if you fancy a pre match drink, there's also the option of a taxi as well.

PRE/POST MATCH

There is a bar at the ground and bars and kiosks inside the ground which are the usual overpriced stuff you find at sports grounds, best bet is to head into town, there are 2 Wetherspoons, The Glass house, as you'd imagine is near to the Glass Museum and Chalon Way car park, but does get busy on matchdays, The Running Horses, is further down Chalon Way and near the big roundabout at the bottom.

Nearer the ground though is The George, on George Street, not far from Parr St/Central car parks, The Royal Alfred across from Central Station and The Swan, on the corner of Corporation St and Hall St, but there are plenty of other bars for different tastes around the town centre.

MATCHDAY

Giants fans are usually allocated the East stand which is covered terracing as well as some seats at the end of the North Stand, on the odd occasion when demand is low, only North Stand seats are allocated, the North Stand is shared with St Helens supporters, the East is generally given over to away fans.
