HGSA Away Days

WARRINGTON WOLVES (43 miles)

Halliwell Jones Stadium - capacity (15,300) Mike Gregory Way, Warrington, WA2 7NE



DIRECTIONS

M62/M60/M62 to J9, first exit, s/p Warrington A49, follow road (Winwick Rd) for about 7 miles, the ground will be on the right but for parking, see below.

PARKING

DO NOT park at Tesco next to the ground!

There are plenty of pay and display car parks in and around the town centre, which is a 5-10 minutes' walk from the ground.

Winwick St/Central station - Follow Road past the ground and Tesco and turn right at the next junction near the wine shop, to the mini roundabout by The Rodney and turn left, the car parks are a right turn off here, either off Winwick St itself or right into Tanners Lane then left past the car wash.

Alternatively, before you reach the ground, turn right after the Ford dealership into Owen St, then left into Dallam Lane and straight down past the ground, turn left at the bottom across from the 3 pigeons and then right into the car park.

There is further parking on Winwick St just past the Kings Head.

For Central station car park, go past the Kings head and turn immediately left.

Should you need it, there's also parking at the Cockhedge shopping centre, go past Central station, under the bridge and turn left.

TRAIN

What used to be the best away day for Giants fans was somewhat ruined when Trans Pennine removed the 50 minute direct service to Warrington Central, now this trip involves a change at Manchester.

Alternatively, there's a direct Northern service to Warrington Bank Quay station from Halifax, Low Moor or Bradford Interchange stations, trip is around 1h20 from Halifax or you can change at Manchester for either station.

PRE/POST MATCH

Warrington is a cracking town for an away day if you like a few drinks, near to the ground is the Kings Head, this is a very popular place for home and away fans, it has a big beer garden and a marquee inside with a DJ etc after the game, additionally, the Rodney, across the road is also a decent pub and popular with home and away fans, bear in mind that these pubs get very busy on matchdays.

The looking glass is also popular, it used to be a Wetherspoons but it's now a free house and serves food too, under the railway and turn left into Scotland St and it's just around the corner, Alternatively, head straight on towards the fountains, turn left into Buttermarket Street and it's at the bottom, on Buttermarket St is The Lower Angel which was popular a while back and served real ales.

In the centre of town is a Wetherspoons, The Friar Penketh, to get there from the ground/car parks/central station, head under the bridge and straight on, past the fountains (turn left here for the looking glass/lower angel) and down the hill through the pedestrianised area, and a short distance of paved road, turn right at the bottom and the pub is on the left, also down here are the feathers and Postern gate pubs.

These pubs are better reached from Bank Quay station, simply cross the road and head straight down Museum St/St Austin's Ln and you'll come to the Postern Gate and Friar Penketh on the corner.

There are eating establishments in and around Golden Square, just down the road from the ground.

MATCHDAY

Away supporters are usually allocated the West Stand, which is covered terracing behind the posts, there are also seats available in the North Stand, and sometimes only the Seating sections are given if there is low demand.

Turnstiles are off Dallam Lane, follow the ground all the way around until you come to the Tesco side of the ground.
